Message from The Portland Foundation

Dear Friends,

Thanks to your generosity, 2024 was another successful year for The Portland Foundation. Donors established thirty new endowment funds, twenty-four of which were unrestricted. Unrestricted endowments allow the Foundation to respond to the ever-changing needs of the Jay County community. The Foundation received \$4.19 million in gifts and awarded \$1.65 million in grants and scholarships. The Foundation held assets of \$55.2 million at the end of the year, with \$4.1 million of the total being the Jay County Early Learning Center.

After a nearly fifteen month renovation, the Jay County Early Learning Center opened in December and is serving Jay County children and families with high-quality early childhood education. The Foundation thanks the organizations who awarded grants totaling \$3 million for the project. The Foundation also thanks Westminster Preschools, the provider at the Early Learning Center, for their partnership and their passion for educating Jay County's youngest citizens.

The Foundation neared completion of the unrestricted endowment matching grant opportunity through Lilly Endowment Inc.'s eighth phase of the Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow (GIFT) Initiative. The Foundation had received \$302,000 of the required \$375,000 in gifts for unrestricted endowments to successfully complete the matching grant opportunity. The Foundation will receive \$750,000 in matching funds when \$375,000 is received.

The Portland Foundation's mission remains the same after 74 years – to enhance the quality of life for the people of Jay County, Indiana, now and for generations to come, by building community endowment, effecting significant impact through grantmaking and providing leadership on key community issues.

The Board of Trustees and staff are blessed to be able to carry out the mission on a daily basis. We are thankful for you and the trust you have placed in us to carry out your philanthropic legacy.

New Funds of the Portland Foundation 2024

UNRESTRICTED FUNDS

Rich and Carolyn Carducci Family Endowment Fund...... \$1,812

Established in 2024 by Richard P. and Carolyn A. Carducci. Richard and Carolyn moved to Jay County in 2001 and were active volunteers in many nonprofit organizations, and Carolyn spent her entire professional career working for charitable organizations. This fund was established with great respect for this community they now call home and in the spirit of the importance of philanthropy. This unrestricted endowment will provide support to Jay County organizations under the direction of the Foundation's Board of Trustees.

John and Diane Coldren Family Endowment Fund......\$10,851

One of his proudest achievements was to be recognized as an artist by both artistic peers and collectors. Steve traveled to Germany, Italy, France and all over America, bringing to canvas his unique perspective on the landscapes and locations that he felt were simply worth painting. His favorite places remained the Indiana landscapes of his childhood. In 2001 he was commissioned by The Portland Foundation to paint a mural of Jay County's key landmarks that was used for a series of collector lithograph prints to raise funds in honor of the Foundation's 50th anniversary. He was one of the founders of the Alcove Arts Club, and taught art classes at the Arts Place, something he truly enjoyed.

Established in 2024 by Michael M. Medler, Patrick N. Medler, and George F. Medler. Frederic Neil "Meatnose" and his wife Elizabeth Ann Medler were successful business owners of Medler's Furniture. They were both active in their community. Neil served 25 years on Portland City Council and as Interim Mayor, Portland Park Board President, Portland Lion's Club President, and Treasurer at Asbury United Methodist for over forty years. Ann was an active member of Tri Kappa Sorority, the Jay County Library Board, and a member of the choir at Asbury United Methodist Church. 



How to Give Through The Portland Foundation

Donors can give to existing funds or create new ones that best serve their needs and charitable interests. Prospective donors are urged to discuss the various options listed below with their attorney, accountant, or other financial advisor.

Endowment Funds

An endowment fund is a living memorial that may carry your family name. It creates a pool of charitable assets that provides enduring charitable support. Donors may choose one of five ways to have their contributions administered.

Unrestricted

The donor allows the Board of Trustees the freedom to choose the grant recipients and respond to changing needs of the community.

Field of Interest

The donor may specify a field of interest, but leaves selection of the exact recipients to the discretion of the Board of Turstees

Restricted

The donor may name one or more particular agencies or institutions to receive grants

Scholarship

The donor outlines the criteria for awards to deserving students so they may pursue educational opportunities.

Donor Advised

The donor may suggest possible grant recipients to the Foundation each year.

Planned Gifts Providing Lifetime Income

Planned gifts provide the benefits of charitable giving, while affording you and loved ones income from the donated assets.

Applying for Grants

The Portland Foundation encourages requests from any new or existing charitable organization or community agency in Jay County.

Grant Policies

Grant proposals must have direct relevance to Jay County charitable needs.

Areas The Portland Foundation wants to support are:

- Start-up costs for new programs
- One-time projects or needs
- Capital needs beyond an applicant organization's capabilities and means

Generally, The Portland Foundation does not support:

- · Individuals, other than scholarships
- Religious or sectarian purposes
- Make-up of operating deficits, post-event or after-the-fact situations
- Endowment campaigns
- Propaganda, political or otherwise, attempting to influence legislation or intervene in any political affairs or campaigns.

Requests are reviewed and voted on twice a year. Deadline dates are typically in January and July and are announced in the local media.

Foundation staff will review the grant request and will contact the requesting organization for any additional information or clarification. Following staff reviews, the proposals are sent to the Board of Trustees for evaluation and funding recommendation.

Following the next regularly scheduled board meeting, applicants are informed in writing of the Board's decisions as well as any conditions place on a grant.
