

No truer words can be spoken when describing 2020. The COVID-19 pandemic altered our lives in many ways. Social distancing and masks became commonplace. Zoom meetings replaced face-to-face ones. Gatherings were either downsized or eliminated altogether. It was a year of many changes for everyone.

One thing that remained the same is your community foundation. The Portland Foundation continued its work to enhance the quality of life in Jay County. Gifts were received, grants and scholarships were awarded and the Foundation finished the year with the greatest number of assets in its history.

The Foundation also continued its work on Lilly Endowment Inc.'s seventh phase of the Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow (GIFT) Initiative. Lilly Endowment Inc. gave the Foundation the opportunity to enhance its community leadership skills through planning and implementation grants. With the planning grant completed, the Foundation prepared to work on developing a strategy to combat the most pressing needs in the community during the implementation grant phase. COVID-19 delayed that work until 2021.

The Foundation also began participation in a 12-month learning lab to develop a Local Impact Investing strategy. Local Impact Investing will allow the Foundation to invest in local for-profit and not-for-profit projects in the community.

As The Portland Foundation continues to carry out its mission to enhance the quality of life in Jay County by building community endowment, awarding grants, and providing leadership on key community issues, we do so with the utmost integrity. We strive to serve donors and grant and scholarship recipients, as we would wish to be served ourselves. Trust is earned, and each day we desire to continue to earn the community's trust.

The board and staff are blessed to be able to serve the community. Each of us thanks you for trusting us with carrying out your philanthropic legacy for Jay County.

You can establish your own fund or add to an existing endowment of The Portland Foundation. Gifts of any size can be added at any time. The Foundation currently administers 399 funds.

John and Dr. Carole Brigham Fund \$207,014 Established in 2002 by John and Carole Brigham. John is a retired banker and former Foundation trustee. Carole is a retired nursing professor at Ball State University.

William Bynum Memorial Fund \$1,809 Established in 2000 by Maxwell Naas through the Naas Family Charitable Endowment. Mr. Bynum was a longtime executive at Naas Foods, Inc. in Portland.

Lawrence H. and Mary Jane Calhoun Memorial Fund \$179,495

Established in 2007 by the Mary Jane Calhoun Estate. Mr. Calhoun was a local pharmacist for many years. He first became associated with Syphers Brothers Drug Store in 1929 and became a partner in 1950. The store later became known as Calhoun Drugs when Lawrence and his wife, Mary Jane, took over complete ownership. The store closed in 1971.

Established in 2001 by the Foundation Board with gifts received towards the Endowment's \$2 million challenge match under Lilly Endowment's GIFT V Initiative.

Robert and Kathleen Cue

Endowment Fund \$37,590

Established in 2015 by the will of Kathleen J. Cue. Mrs. Cue had worked at the Haynes Milling Company, Mutual Security, and the Jay County Genealogy office. This unrestricted endowment will provide support to Jay County organizations under the direction of the Foundation's Board of Trustees.

James L. & Claudia A. Cull and Bill J. & Mary C. Davis Family Endowment Fund \$163,471

Established in 2014 by James & Claudia Cull and Bill & Mary Davis. This unrestricted endowment will provide support to Jay County organizations under the direction of the Foundation's Board of Trustees. Jim is a 1964 graduate of Portland High School. A Portland Foundation scholarship helped pay for his degree in chemical engineering. Claudia is a

Cleveland native and taught elementary school children for 36 years. As residents of Cleveland Heights, they have served on numerous boards and commissions in the Cleveland area. The Davis' were longtime Jay County business owners and civic leaders. They were owners of Limestone Products, Inc. while Mary was an educator with Jay Schools and served as a member of the Foundation's Board of Trustees and Bill served as a founding member of the Jay County Development Corporation Board of Directors as well as District 33 Representative in the Indiana General Assembly.

Ted C. Fleming and Alma M. Fleming Endowment Fund \$302,211

Established in 2013 by the Ted Fleming Estate as a memorial to himself and his sister. Alma owned the Jay County Abstract Company and Ted was an employee of the company.

How to Give Through The Portland Foundation

Donors can give to existing funds or create new ones that best serve their needs and charitable interests. Prospective donors are urged to discuss the various options listed below with their attorney, accountant, or other financial advisor.

Endowment Funds

An endowment fund is a living memorial that may carry your family name. It creates a pool of charitable assets that provides enduring charitable support. Donors may choose one of five ways to have their contributions administered:

Unrestricted

The donor allows the Board of Trustees the freedom to choose the grant recipients and respond to changing needs in the community.

Field of Interest

The donor may specify a field of interest, but leaves selection of the exact recipients to the discretion of the Board of Trustees.

Restricted

The donor may name one or more particular agencies or institutions to receive grants.

Scholarship

The donor outlines the criteria for awards to deserving students so they may pursue educational opportunities.

Donor Advised

The donor may suggest possible grant recipients to the Foundation each year.

Planned Gifts Providing Lifetime Income

Planned gifts provide the benefits of charitable giving, while affording you and loved ones income from the donated assets.

Through The Portland Foundation, donors have the opportunity to preserve and strengthen the Jay County community. For information on these and other ways to use The Portland Foundation, call Doug Inman at (260) 726-4260.

Applying for Grants

The Portland Foundation encourages requests from any new or existing charitable organization or community agency in Jay County.

Grant Policies

Grant proposals must have direct relevance to Jay County charitable needs.

Areas The Portland Foundation wants to support are:

- Start-up costs for new programs
- One-time projects or needs
- Capital needs beyond an applicant organization's capabilities and means

Generally, The Portland Foundation does not support:

- Individuals, other than scholarships
- Religious or sectarian purposes
- Make-up of operating deficits, post-event or after-the-fact situations
- Endowment campaigns
- Propaganda, political or otherwise, attempting to influence legislation or intervene in any political affairs or campaigns

Requests are reviewed and voted on twice a year. Deadline dates are typically in January and July and are announced in the local media.

Foundation staff will review the grant request and will contact the requesting organization for any additional information or clarification. Following staff review, the proposals are sent to the Board of Trustees for evaluation and funding recommendation.

Following the next regularly scheduled board meeting, applicants are informed in writing of the Board's decisions as well as any conditions placed on a grant.

The mission of The Portland Foundation is to enhance the quality of life for the people of Jay County, Indiana, now and for generations to come, by building community endowment, effecting significant impact through grantmaking and providing leadership on key community issues.
